

DRINKS WHISKY AND DIES.

Theodore Nelson of Norway Dies in Ottawa Sunday From an Overdose of Whisky.

Theodore Nelson, a 43 year old farmer and tiler who lived near Norway, in Mission township, forfeited his life in Ottawa last Sunday by the rapid drinking of a half pint of whisky.

At about 8 o'clock Sunday forenoon Nelson came down the railroad by the Brickton plant where he found one Hana Hulliguaro sitting under the hedge in an intoxicated condition and Nelson asked him if he had any liquor when his companion answered in the affirmative and produced a pint bottle about half full of whisky which he handed to Nelson who drank the entire contents at about three swallows and layed down to sleep. Hulliguaro also went to sleep and got up at five o'clock in the afternoon and went into a nearby yard for a drink of water, which he procured and upon returning to Nelson for the purpose of waking him found that he was dead and had been for some hours.

The police were notified and Nelson was taken to the morgue. It was ascertained that his mother, Mrs. Mary Nelson, lived at Gienwood, Minn., and she was notified of the death by telegraph.

The police have found the men who sold the whisky on Sunday morning and doubtless there will be something doing before Justice Koenig in the near future.
