MARSEILLES — Edgar E. Emmett, 79, of Marseilles, passed away Sunday, June 5, at OSF St. Francis Medical Center.

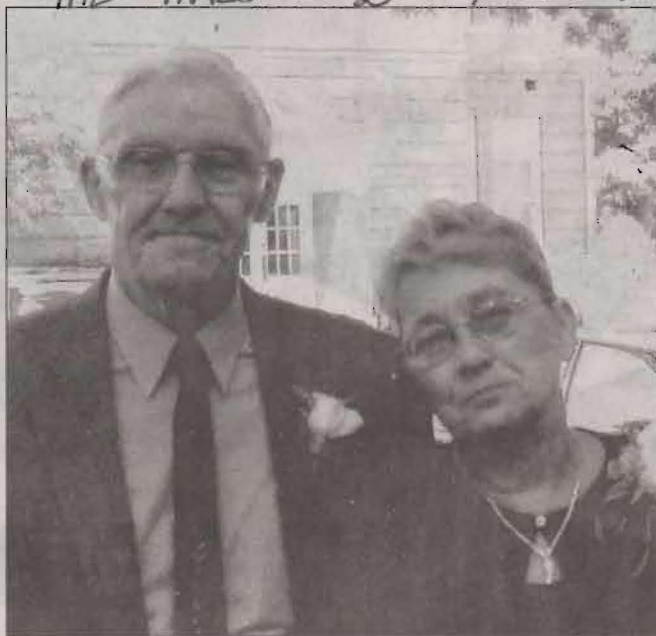
